GDCH TERMS

SCHP LEARNING PLATFORM

Our online learning environment. Each subject provides learning guides, webcasts, reading material, information about assessments, and course announcements.

CENSUS DATE

The date by which tuition fees and student contributions must be paid. It is the last day for students to make changes to their subjects without incurring financial liability or academic penalties.

Eligible students can choose to defer payment of their fees via a HELP loan, but applications for deferment of tuition fees or student contributions must be made on or before the census date.

ASSESSMENT EXTENSION FORM

This online form is available under the Introduction section of each subject on the SCHP learning platform.

While students are expected to submit their assessments on time and manage their own study-work-life balance, we understand that extenuating circumstances can happen. Request for extensions will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

LEARNING GUIDE

The learning guide outlines student responsibilities, subject information, assessments, and expectations for passing the subject in the GDCH.

WEBCASTS

Webcasts are recorded lectures that can be accessed at anytime on the SCHP Learning Platform.

STUDENT HANDBOOK

Students can search the WSU Handbook for subjects under the [Graduate Diploma in Child Health \(4793\) here](#).

MYWESTERN

This system serves as a student portal providing access to applications, systems, and notifications at Western. It allows students to check emails, access student systems, and stay informed about important news and events.

SSAF

The Student Services and Amenities Fee are allocated to student services and amenities such as sports, recreation, employment and career advice, health and welfare, study skills programs, orientation, childcare, financial advice, services for international students, and food services.

TURNITIN

An online system used for plagiarism detection and referencing checks. It compares students' work against documents in the Turnitin database and online sources, generating reports on document similarities.

WESTERNACCOUNT

This account gives students access to University online services and systems such as student email and MySR.

GDCH STUDENT GROUP

The GDCH Student Group can be accessed via the SCHP learning platform as an online space for students to interact and engage in tutorial and other relevant course discussions. Course updates and announcements will also be made on the Group's news board.

WESTERN EFORMS

Students can access the University's online system to submit admin forms online such as Rule Waiver, Review of Grade, and Enrolment Deferrals.

REGISTER FOR SUBJECTS

Now that you have accepted your letter of offer, the next step is to register for subjects.

You can find more information about each subject in the [WSU Academic Handbook](#).

The Graduate Diploma in Child Health (4793) consists of 8 subjects, listed below:

- MEDI 5001 Newborn and Infant Development
- MEDI 5002 Behaviour, Development and Disability
- MEDI 5003 Adolescent, Mental Health and Health Inequity
- MEDI 5004 Emergency and Acute Care

Students may exit with a Graduate Certificate in Child Health at this point- completion of the top 4 subjects.

- MEDI 6001 Cardiorespiratory, ENT and Allergy
- MEDI 6002 Gastroenterology, Urology and other specialties
- MEDI 6003 Infectious Disease and Autoimmune Conditions
- MEDI6004 Neurology, Musculoskeletal and Surgical Problems

REGISTER

When you are ready to register for subjects, head over to [MySR](#) to get started.

- In MySR, go to “Registrations” section then select “Register for Subjects”.
- Select the Term you are enrolling into. (E.g. 2023 Quarter, or All Terms)
- Search for the subject code, click “Add” and click “Submit”
- Receive a confirmation when registration is successful.
- Receive email containing your learner account and instructions on how to access your subjects.

Remember:

- Your learner account will be ready atleast two weeks prior to the Quarter start date. Keep an eye on your junk/spam folder for a notification.
- GDCH runs on Quarter sessions.
- You may register for up to two subjects per quarter.

ACCESS TO SUBJECTS

After registering, please keep an eye on your Western Sydney University student inbox for an email from our team (service@schp.org.au).

NEW STUDENT?

Please do not self-register on the SCHP Learning Platform using your student email.

We will notify you when your account is ready. Once received, you will need to click on **“Forgot Password”** to complete the account setup.

EXISTING STUDENT?

Your subjects will be automatically added to your learner account on the SCHP Learning Platform.

SUBJECTS NOT APPEARING?

- It may take up to 72 hours for subjects to be added to your account.
- Check your student email inbox regularly including the junk/spam folder.
- Subjects will be available at least one week prior to the Quarter start date.



You will receive a notification when your learner account is ready on the SCHP Learning Platform.
